His July 7 1933

Dear Eunice Ma & Isaac
Greeting in Jesus name. Last night
was my first service here at Exeland
in a schoolhouse 5 mile south
towards Ladysmith, a good sized crowd,
and very interesting. So many poor
people. And how they will sit and listen.

Up to this time, we have two to
receive at Sheldon by Peter & Hans
two boys by Baptism, and this
forenoon I met Polly Kauffman,
had a long visit with her, and
she wants to be taken up which
will mean 5 on this trip.

and there may be others
with what I seen last night.
Well by this time you have my
cards of the fourth. I mailed
Charity and Ruth each one.

I certainly was glad for
your letter. I received it this morn
here at Sinclair's. I was glad for
the news especially rains. it is very
dry here in Wis crops burning up.
People are moving their oats for
hay. This morning had a light rain.
I hope the weather has been such
that the boys were able to get

the hay mowed. if not put up.
Now I am beginning to think
of Monday. I expect to leave here
to get to Fargo by Monday eve.
if no one there to meet me at
the Webster by 8.30 p.m. then I
will go to Heabera.

I met Anna May this
morning. to bad for her. a
girl had better go through
life single yes a 100 times
better than to be married to a
thing that looks like a man.
and no doubt loose her soul
through it.

Now I could write much
and spend much time here in
trying to win people to Christ
but must hasten or get
through and come home.

God keep watch between
us until I arrive home.
